Re: OCLA Underwriting of PILF Students Working on Housing Justice Issues With King County Bar Association Housing Justice Project

Dear Dean Varona,


This letter memorializes the agreement embedded in the most recent Housing Justice Collaborative description that the Office of Civil Legal Aid (OCLA) will underwrite three Seattle University School of Law Public Interest Law Foundation (PILF) scholarships to place qualified students with the King County Bar Association's Housing Justice Project during the summer of 2025. It is understood that OCLA places a very high priority on supporting the efforts of non-traditional law students entering the pipeline for community based civil legal aid careers. It is understood that Seattle University School of Law is equally committed to developing and placing non-traditional law students into public service practice. OCLA's investment in this relationship serves that objective.

Consistent with these objectives, OCLA will underwrite three (3) scholarships for housing justice placements at the King County Bar Association's Housing Justice Project during the summer of 2025. OCLA will pay Seattle University School of Law the sum of seven thousand dollars (\$7,000) per student. These funds will need to be billed for on or before July 10, 2025. Seattle University School of Law agrees to recruit, support, and oversee the work of these public interest law students during their engagement with the King County Bar Association's Housing Justice Project. Each student shall provide OCLA with a narrative report on their experience during the period of their internships.


